Super Sprint NZ Racing school visit the Ruapuna racetrack on Friday the 9th of February.

Mrs Karen Rennie took four Year 11 students to the Euromarque Motorsport Park for a guided tour to see the various roles that make up a top-tier championship series. Part of the visit was a tour of the broadcast compound by one of the TV hosts.

What they saw during their guided tour:

- A view of the pit-lane in operation where the cars are checked by team mechanics
- The timing room where the cars are tracked and timed to 1,000 of a second
- The Toyota Gazoo Racing transporter
- A close-up look at one of the CTFROC open-wheel cars
- The Super Sprint Productions television broadcast compound
- A look at the Summerset GT New Zealand cars
- A look at the Super V8 category and the brand new TA2 V8 race car
- A look at a Formula Ford race car and team the entry level category

There were guest appearances from drivers, managers, and TV presenters.



Students' highlights:

Anna-Rose: I enjoyed seeing them test drive the vehicles and make sure that everything is working for the race the next day. I also enjoyed seeing how all the broadcasting and news stations work. The best part for me was seeing how the cars engines work around the track and what sort of techniques they used to maintain the engines.

Danielle: My highlights were getting to see the behind the scenes in the broadcast room, how they video and edit the footage and seeing all the cars go around the track and how we got to sit in one which was cool.

Emma: My favorite part of going to the racetrack was sitting inside one of the race cars. Watching the cars circle the track. I also enjoyed learning about the media side of it, being shown all the cameras and how the buttons are used on the board. Where they film the commentators and being showed that there is other area in race car driving.

Joslyne: My highlights for the event would be being able to get a closer look at the cars and being able to see behind the scenes. Being able to see what goes on behind it all was and eye opener since many thing its just a one-man job but it isn't it is a team which was amazing to see.

NOTICE FROM ENVIRONMENT CANTERBURY—METRO BUS

Upcoming fare changes mean 5-12 year olds need to top up their Metro cards

As of 1 May, 5-12-year-old's will no longer travel for free on the bus following the government's changes to its Community Connect concessions scheme. This is a nationwide change, decided by the new government. Children 4 years old and under will continue to travel for free without a Metrocard.

Children 5-12 will now need to top up their Metro cards in order to pay the \$1 bus and \$2 ferry concessions as part of the half-price Under 25 concession from May 1. The Council had already planned for the continuation of the Under 25 concession in its 2022/23 Annual Plan, as part of its <u>flat fare trial</u>.

All other Metro concessions for Greater Christchurch will remain the same including Community Services Card holders, tertiary students, and Total Mobility customers.

All Greater Christchurch Metro fares can be viewed here.

We want to make sure that parents and their children are aware of this change well ahead of time.
