The two recipients are Sionann Murphy from Auckland and **Zack Lappin** from Christchurch! Congratulations to you both!



Kia ora koutou We are seeking your feedback on the proposed NCEA subjects derived from The New Zealand Curriculum (at Levels 2 & 3) and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa (across all Levels) between 16 June and close 11 August.

The proposals include new mātauranga Māori subjects in The New Zealand Curriculum and in Te Marautanga o Aotearoa to give effect to the Government's vision for NCEA to reflect Mana ōrite mō te mātauranga Māori (parity for Māori knowledge). The proposals also support the Government's commitment to deliver opportunities for greater specialisation at Levels 2 and 3. Some of the proposed new subjects will require further scoping prior to development work commencing.

The feedback we receive from the sector through this engagement process will inform the Ministry's final decision.

To support the public to provide feedback, a survey is available on our website at NCEA.education.govt.nz - as well as discussion documents for subjects in both The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa, fact sheets and other resource materials. Have your say.... by 11 August.
