Events like the recent flooding, are tough for everyone involved.

Our tamariki may not understand what is happening **but** there are ways we can support them. What they see and hear from us will have a big impact on how they do - now and also over the coming months.

Top tips to support your tamariki and your whānau

Tamariki will cue off you — so if you're okay, they'll be okay too (see below for our tips to keep yourself feeling okay in all this too).

Be mindful how much 'worry' you're displaying, just be as cool as you can! It's

okay to show that you're sad or tired but reassure them that you are still able to keep them safe, and that how you're feeling isn't their fault.

Keep your tamariki away from too much worrying media and adult conversations about the impacts. But they will love celebrating the little victories with you, and sharing plans for better days ahead (even if you don't have all the details right now).

Let them join in projects as they can – they'll want to feel like they can help. Answer their questions pretty matter-of-fact style and in very 'general' terms. Keep the reassurance low key too – over-reassuring can make us think we need to be worrying more than we are!

And if they're a bit clingy, or grumpy or find it hard to sleep...that's to be expected. Most people will need more reassurance and kindness in such moments.
